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About the AFSA Education Foundation & MoneySKILL®

he AFSA Education Foundation was founded by members of the <u>American Financial Services Association (AFSA)</u> as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit in 1990. The foundation's mission is to educate consumers of all ages on personal finance concepts and help them realize the benefits of responsible money management while also gaining a better understanding of the credit process. Study after study show that financial education leads to better financial decision-making and increased financial security, yet Americans frequently fall short when it comes to grasping basic financial concepts. For this reason, the AFSA Education Foundation continues to provide high-quality, accessible financial education resources, particularly for the benefit of youth and young adults who are just beginning a lifetime journey filled with important and long-lasting financial decisions.

In support of its mission, the AFSA Education Foundation offers a wide breadth of personal finance resources, including access to MoneySKILL, a free online personal finance curriculum designed for middle school, high school, and college instructors. MoneySKILL was launched in 2002 and provides educators with a flexible platform to create custom, web-based personal finance courses that can be used in a variety of different classroom environments, including virtual. The curriculum includes 37 different topic areas focused on a broad range of money management fundamentals and allows instructors to monitor student progress through quizzes and pre- and post-test exams. In addition to being completely free (and ad-free) for all educators, MoneySKILL is offered in English and Spanish, contains audio dictation options, and aligns with nationally recognized personal finance standards.

The foundation is committed to ensuring that MoneySKILL remains a valuable and relevant resource, and in the years since it was first launched, the course has undergone several major content revisions as well as significant platform design and functionality enhancements. A <u>recent evaluation</u> of aggregate test data also shows that students completing MoneySKILL, on average, receive post-test scores 65% higher than their initial benchmark exams, indicating a significant growth in personal finance knowledge. Furthermore, in addition to financial knowledge gains, the introduction of MoneySKILL in high schools has shown to improve financial behaviors as well.

MoneySKILL continues to increase its reach each year with over 1.4 million users enrolling in the program since its launch and, in recent years, has been utilized in over 50% of all U.S. counties. MoneySKILL has also been recognized and referenced over the years by organizations including the U.S. Department of Treasury, the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, the Jump\$tart Coalition for Personal Financial Literacy, and more.

Since the AFSA Education Foundation was founded, AFSA members have been incredibly supportive of the organization and the MoneySKILL program. The foundation has developed the MoneySKILL Ambassador program and this toolkit to continue to grow the reach and impact of the MoneySKILL program and all of the other free personal finance resources made available by the AFSA Education Foundation.
